The story of the World's Largest Hand-Dug Well began in the 1880s when both the Santa Fe and Rock Island railroads were laying tracks across the plains of Kansas. A large supply of water was needed for the steam locomotives and for the people of the area. When the well was completed in 1887, it was 109 feet deep and 32 feet in diameter. The well was covered and opened as an historic attraction in 1937.

In 1972, the United States Government designated the Big Well as a National Museum and in February of 1974 it was awarded an American Water Landmark by the American Water Works Association. Over three million visitors from every state in the nation and many foreign countries have descended the metal stairway into the cavern of the World's Largest Hand Dug Well. Now, the only thing that remains is the Well itself.


